

2010 RECYCLING INFORMATION

**The following items are to be mixed together in your recycling cart for bi-weekly pickup
ALL ITEMS MUST BE IN THE CART-
ANY ITEMS OUTSIDE THE CART WILL NOT BE TAKEN**

GLASS	All colors accepted (brown, green and clear) Rinse item out and throw away the lids; labels need not be removed NO ceramics, paned glass, auto glass, Pyrex or light bulbs
PLASTIC	Plastics #1 through #7 will be accepted (such as plastic milk jugs, plastic soda bottles and margarine containers) Rinse item out and throw away the caps or lids; labels need not be removed NO motor oil or gasoline bottles or plastic bags
ALUMINUM CANS	Rinse item out; labels should be removed Cans may be crushed – other items accepted include clean foil and pie plates NO other aluminum products accepted
EMPTY AEROSOL CONTAINERS	Containers must be empty; Labels do not need to be removed; Any <u>empty</u> aerosol containers may be recycled (including paint and pesticide containers)
TIN CANS	Food and beverage cans only Rinse item out; labels should be removed, cans may be crushed NO other tin products accepted
PAPER and CARDBOARD PRODUCTS	All paper products, including but not limited to: newspapers, magazines, phone books, packaged junk mail, office paper, shredded paper, cereal and tissue boxes, soda cartons, and all forms of cardboard including corrugated. All paper and cardboard should be put in cart <u>LOOSE</u> (not bundled or in brown paper bags). NO cardboard items soiled with food (such as pizza boxes).

2010 REFUSE / GARBAGE INFORMATION

ACCEPTED	NOT ACCEPTED
Residents to provide their own garbage container (bags or cans no larger than 40 gallon plastic or 32 gallon metal)	Large furniture (anything over 4' and/or over 50 lbs such as couches, mattresses, etc.)
MAXIMUM of six cans or bags per week per building	Containers over 40 gallons and/or over 50 lbs
Cans or bags can not weigh more than 50 lbs	Automotive batteries, tires, motor oil or gasoline
Carpeting – bundled and tied in sections under 4' wide and less than 50 lbs per bundle – 10 bundles per week	Large auto parts (engine blocks, heads, fenders, etc.) or small engines (lawnmower, snowblower, etc.)
Small appliances – toasters, radios, small televisions under 4' and less than 50 lbs	Toxic or hazardous waste, including explosives or ammunitions
Small furniture – under 4' and less than 50 lbs	Grass clippings, yard waste and brush
Household alkaline batteries	"White appliances" such as stoves, ovens, refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, hot water heaters, microwaves, washers, dryers, dehumidifiers, dishwashers. For these types of appliances or any large furniture items, check with the retailer on trading in your old appliance at purchase or contact the Public Works Department at 375-7609 regarding the Appliance Pickup Program.
Small amounts of stone or concrete - placed in containers and no more than 50 lbs per week	
Minor construction debris – placed in container or bundled/tied – less than 4' & no more than 50 lbs per week	
Christmas trees and wreaths	
Paint – must be dried out (may mix in sand or kitty litter to assist in the drying), lid removed & placed next to garbage	

HOLIDAYS AFFECTING PICKUP IN 2010:

Memorial Day (May 31) – Entire week- refuse delayed ONE day because of the holiday
 Labor Day (September 6) – Entire week - refuse delayed ONE day because of the holiday
 Thanksgiving (November 25) – Thursday's refuse and recycling pickup delayed until Friday

All refuse and recycling containers must be stored within a garage or accessory structure or in a location screened from street view.
