

Rushing also inquired about the possibility of campers renting out private property.

Motion made by Terry Wagner, seconded by Paul Rushing, to approve a temporary ordinance change to allow camping in parks on a trial basis. Motion carried without a negative vote with Scott King and Council Member Mitch Regenfuss excused.

Review Park and Open Space Plan; and Action Thereon

Director Hilvo explained that there were new maps sent out in the meeting packets and also passed out a new proposed park map. Director Hilvo described, in detail, all areas of the new maps and explained that no new parks or big projects will be happening in the next five to ten years, due to other City needs and projects. He also said to forward him any other questions that come up in the future in regards to the Park and Open Space Plan.

NEW BUSINESS

Review Park Survey Results; and Action Thereon

Director Hilvo described the results from the park survey. He said the survey was advertised on Facebook, Constant Contact and in the News Graphic. There were a total of 108 responses comprised of 75 city residents, 10 town residents and 23 non-residents. Many of the surveys included requests for more pickleball courts and an indoor sports complex. There were also an unusual amount of responses regarding the need for more canoe/kayak areas. Director Hilvo said this report will go into the Park and Open Space Plan as an informational piece.

REPORTS

Director Hilvo mentioned that members of the Common Council are still meeting and negotiating with the Cedarburg School District in regards to the Cedarburg High School tennis courts.

Superintendent Bultman gave an update on her programs stating that the youth basketball league will be ending this weekend with a tournament. She also mentioned that the Summer recreation guide is currently being worked on and will include new dance/poms programs and a rugby clinic. There will also be STEM classes offered during spring break in addition to the annual Easter Egg Hunt

Superintendent Westphal gave an update on parks and forestry projects. He mentioned that they are pruning over 500 trees and working on pre-construction pruning. He also said that the Boy Scout House ice was in great shape, but had to be shut down due to weather concerns during the Winter Festival. He is also currently working on specs and purchase orders for new equipment.
