PRESENTATION BY SAMANTHA BEAR, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR CEDARBURG MERCANTILE AND BLOSSOM IDD

Samantha Bear described the mission and work of Cedarburg Mercantile and Blossom IDD. Data was shared with the Diversity Committee regarding the number of individuals that identify as having a disability, this current number being around 800 individuals in the City of Cedarburg. Benefits of living in the City and County as well as barriers to living in the City and County were presented. Samantha shared her background as an educator and invited Community members and Committee members to reach out to her with questions about pilot programs, services provided and opportunities to rent out the mercantile, volunteer with Blossom IDD, or be involved in other ways. Members of the Committee asked questions related to whether Blossom IDD works with the School District, how the newly installed ramp to access the building came to fruition and how to support individuals with disabilities in our community, including but not limited to panel discussions similar to Cedarburg Community Conversations. Ms. Bear noted the importance of websites being developed with accessibility in mind, and an area the Committee can inquire regarding our City of Cedarburg website, apps etc.
