NEW BUSINESS

FORMAL APPOINTMENT OF BEN COLLINS AS GENERAL MANAGER, AND ALTERNATE DIRECTOR TO THE WPPI ENERGY BOARD OF DIRECTORS; AND ACTION THEREON

General Manger Emeritus Dale Lythjohan and the Commission welcomed Ben Collins.

A motion was made by Patricia Thome, seconded by Joe Dorr, to appoint Ben Collins as General Manager, and to name Ben Collins as Alternate Director to WPPI Energy Board of Directors. Motion carried.

UPDATE ON LEAD SERVICE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Water Superintendent Tim Martin gave an update on the lead service replacement project. Phase One of the program has been completed with approximately 120 replacements. Tim discussed the costs covered by the grant funding, costs not covered by grant funding, and future funding updates. Phase Two will begin next week at the Cedarburg Woolen Mill on Washington and Bridge, and the replacements will continue north on Washington and will include about 45 replacements.

CITY COUNCIL, MANAGER AND DEPARTMENT REPORTS

The Manager & Department Reports were provided to the commissioners in advance of the meeting. The full reports can be reviewed in the electronic commission packet.

Electric Update:

- Outages

 - \circ 2018 year-end total \rightarrow 11

Water Update:

 Liquid Engineering Corp. will be cleaning out the million gallon reservoir and the 50,000 gallon concrete reservoir at well #5. They will utilize SCUBA divers and a vacuum to complete this process. Both tanks will be drained in October to complete the DNR required tank inspections. "Empty tank" inspections are required once every 10 years.

Office Update:

- New electric rates will be in effect October 1. Customers will receive a new rate sheet with their November bill.
- Management is currently in the underwriting process to determine the surcharge to buy into the Wisconsin Public Employers' Group Health Insurance program (WPE). The 2023 rates have been published.
- The water rate application was filed with the PSC on 9/2/2022. CL&W is requesting a 4.5% rate of return, an estimated increase of 12.88%, as previously indicated in the cash flow model.
